Kristine Delkus is a Director of TC Pipelines GP, Inc. (general partner of TC PipeLines, LP). Ms. Delkus is also Deputy General Counsel, Pipelines & Regulatory Affairs for TransCanada Corporation where she is responsible for the legal aspects of all regulatory and commercial matters for TransCanada's pipeline business in Canada and the United States. Ms. Delkus is also responsible for providing regulatory law counselling and advocacy services relating to the company's Energy activities.

Since joining the company in June, 1995, Ms. Delkus has held a variety of progressively more senior roles with the organization. Prior to her current role, Ms. Delkus was Vice-President, Law Gas Transmission from 2004 to 2006. Other roles at TransCanada have included Vice-President Power and Regulatory Law, Senior Legal Counsel, U.S. Regulatory Law; Associate General Counsel, U.S. Regulatory Law and North American Pipeline Ventures; and Vice-President, Law, Trading & Business Development.

Prior to coming to TransCanada, Ms. Delkus worked at Morgan, Lewis & Bockius in Washington, D.C., where she was a Senior Associate in the government regulation section of a U.S. national law firm, specializing in energy issues. There, she represented natural gas, oil and electric industry clients and trade associations before the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission and Department of Energy and in appellate proceedings before the federal circuit courts.

Ms. Delkus holds a Bachelor of Arts degree (with Honours) in Public Administration from Carleton University. She was awarded her Bachelor of Laws degree from the University of Windsor. Ms. Delkus holds bar memberships in New York, Ontario and Alberta. She has a variety of publications to her credit.

Ms. Delkus is the 1997 TransCanada President's Award recipient for outstanding achievement. She is the past Chair for the Canadian Lymphedema Foundation, a member of the Energy Bar Association and has served on the Board of Directors for Junior Achievement for Southern Alberta. Ms. Delkus was also named one of the Top 100 Most Powerful Women in Canada for 2010.
