Jon Dobson was appointed Secretary of the General Partner in May 2014.

Mr. Dobson's principal occupation is Director, U.S. Governance and Securities Law in the U.S. Corporate Secretarial group of TransCanada. He joined TransCanada in January 2011 as Senior Legal Counsel and held that position until his appointment as Associate General Counsel, Corporate and Securities Law 2011. He is also Corporate Secretary for the U.S. subsidiaries of TransCanada. Based in Houston, Mr. Dobson is responsible for U.S. corporate secretarial functions, securities law compliance, corporate governance and general corporate legal matters.

Prior to joining TransCanada, Mr. Dobson spent 18 years practicing law in corporate legal positions and private practice, most recently as Vice-President and Assistant General Counsel of Nash Finch Company, a Fortune 500 wholesale food distributor and grocery retailer headquartered in Minneapolis, Minnesota. He served as outside legal counsel and corporate secretary for privately and publicly-held clients from April 2005 until accepting the position with Nash Finch in May 2008. From April 1995 to April 2005, Mr. Dobson held increasingly senior positions at BMC Industries, Inc., a publicly-held, multi-national diversified manufacturing company headquartered in Minneapolis, including Vice-President, General Counsel & Secretary from November 2001 to April 2005, Vice-President of Human Resources, General Counsel & Secretary from November 1999 to November 2001, General Counsel & Secretary from December 1997 to November 1999 and Director of Legal Services from April 1995 to December 1997. Before moving to BMC, Mr. Dobson worked from August 1992 to April 1995 as an associate attorney in the Minneapolis office of Lindquist & Vennum PLLP, practicing exclusively in corporate and securities law.

Mr. Dobson is a member of the New York and Minnesota bar. He serves on an in-house securities law advisory panel and mentors young in-house attorneys through the Association of Corporate Counsel. He earned his Bachelor of Arts in History and Economics, with High Honor, from South Dakota State University in 1989 and his Juris Doctorate, with Sterling Honors, from the University of South Dakota School of Law in 1992. From August 1991 to December 1991, Mr. Dobson studied international law in London, England at the University of Detroit-Mercy London Law Program.
